### Biowaste Bin

#### Yes

- Vegetable waste and fruit peelings
- Egg- and nutshells
- Cooked leftovers (wrapped in newspaper)
- Tea bags, Filter bags with coffee grounds
- Tree and bush cuttings, Lawn cuttings
- Fish bones
- Remnants of cut flowers
- Weeds (wild herbs)



#### No !

- Materials, that can not be converted into compost f.i. Stones, Plastic Foil
- Residual Waste
- Foodstuff in Packaging

#### Our tip:

Please wrap moist or strong smelling foods in newspaper or something similar.

### Residual Waste Bin

#### Yes

- Ashes and Cigarette butts
- Vacuum cleaner bags
- Cat and animal litter
- Diapers and nappies
- Porcelain, ceramics
- Carpet and Wallpaper remnants
- Ladies tights and Tampons
- Candle stubs
- Toys (defective)
- Plastic buckets



#### No !

- Pollutants, like liquid paints, lac
- Batteries
- Pesticides
- Energy-saving bulbs
- Paint remover

#### Our tip:

Electrical and electronic devices may not be disposed of in the residual waste bin.

### Paper Bin

#### Yes

- Cartons
- Newspapers, Magazines
- Catalogues
- Brochures
- Books
- Cardboard



#### No !

- Plastic foils
- Heavily soiled paper
- Tetra Paks

### Yellow Bag / Yellow Bin

#### Yes

- Aluminium foil
- Beverage and milk cartons
- Vacuum package materials
- Plastic bottles (from personal hygiene, detergent and washing agents)
- Plastic tubs (Yoghurt tubs, Margarine tubs)
- Tin cans



#### No !

- Compostable waste
- Residual waste
- Glass
- Paper and cardboard

#### Our tip:

Please put packages made of paper into the Paper Bin and those made of glass into the waste glass container.
